PTI Nebraska (Parent Training and Information) is a resource for families of children with disabilities or special health needs. Empowers parents and provides knowledge to improve education and healthcare for children.

#### **Financial Aid**

**Aid to the Aged, Blind, or Disabled (AABD) Payment Program** provides cash payment to persons who are blind or disabled based on Social Security qualifications.

**Disabled Persons and Family Support** (DPFS) Program provides state-funded assistance to persons of all ages who meet certain tests, including income and disability tests. The program helps people with disabilities remain employed, stay independent, and live at home. Eligible individuals may receive funding for specific services, up to \$300 a month or \$3,600 annually.

**Economic Assistance Programs** promotes wellbeing and provide support to achieve self-sufficiency of families, children, individuals, elderly, and persons with disabilities by providing medical, nutritional, and financial services.

Emergency Assistance Program provides help to families in situations which are threatening the health or wellbeing of an eligible child and family. Emergency assistance payments may be made for shelter expenses, relocation expenses or non-medical transportation.

Katie Beckett Program provides Medicaid eligibility to children who otherwise would be hospitalized because of their high level of health care needs. Through Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services.

Medically Handicapped Children's Program provides specialized medical services for children and youth with special health care needs. Services include service coordination/case management, specialty medical team evaluations, access to specialty physicians, and payment of authorized medical services.

Nebraska Community Action Agencies
Nebraska has nine community action
agencies located across the state that offer
support to low-income individuals and
families. Services can include economic
assistance, employment supports, loans and
education programs.

The Division of Developmental Disabilities (DHHS-DD) provides funding and oversight for Medicaid home and community-based developmental disabilities waiver services. This includes determining eligibility, providing service coordination for eligible people, monitoring services and paying DD providers.

#### **Legal Advocacy**

**Disability Rights Nebraska** provides individual advocacy, advice on legal rights, information about disability rights and services, and referrals.

**Legal Aid of Nebraska** assistance with legal issues.

**UNL Center for Children, Families, and the Law** works to improve systems and outcomes for children and families.

## Treatment and Rehabilitation

**Madonna Rehabilitation** Brain Injury rehabilitation program serving all levels of brain injury.

**Munroe-Meyer Institute** Provides services and support for people with intellectual, developmental, and genetic disorders.

**QLI Omaha Brain Injury Rehabilitation Program** is a specialized, post-hospital center of excellence for individuals who have sustained an acquired brain injury.

### **Non-Profit Resources**

Arc of Nebraska is a non-profit, volunteer-based membership organization whose primary role is to advocate for the rights and protections of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families. Provides support for families as they seek to understand the waiver system, access education, find employment, access housing, and much more.

**Easterseals Nebraska** Provides services to help people with disabilities have an equal opportunity to live, learn, work, and play.

**Nebraska Ticket to Work** A centralized source of information to explore competitive employment opportunities.

**Nebraska VR** assists individuals with injuries, illnesses, or impairments achieve competitive employment and increased independence.

**United Cerebral Palsy of Nebraska**Educates, advocates, and provides support through an affiliate network to ensure a life without limits for people with disabilities.

**Dream Foundation** Volunteer-driven wishgranting organization that serves children ages 3-18 who have a critical or chronic illness.

Easter Seals offers a variety of services to help people with disabilities address life's challenges from child development centers to physical rehabilitation and job training for people with disabilities.

**Fund It Forward** For anyone with a diagnosed disability or medical condition in need of medical devices or equipment.

**Granted Wish Foundation** Sports/Athlete specific wishes for people with a physical disability age 5-25.

**iHOPE** - The International Academy of Hope is a highly specialized brain injury school in New York City funded by the Sarah Jane Brain Foundation (SJBF). The mission of SJBF is to change the world for children, youth and young adults who suffer from brain injury and other brain-based disorders by improving services, training and research in this country and beyond.

Make A Wish Foundation grants the wish of a child diagnosed with a life-threatening medical condition in the United States and its territories.

**Mclindon Family Foundation** Gives adaptive bikes to children with disabilities.

**Modest Needs** Short term critical-need financial assistance for those who do not qualify for traditional assistance because of income level.

National AMBUCS, Inc. is creating mobility and independence for people with disabilities by therapeutic tricycles to individuals unable to operate a traditional bike, awarding academic scholarships for therapists, and performing various other forms of community service.

**National MS Society** Resources, support and programs for those living with multiple sclerosis.

National Patient Travel HELPLINE Provides assistance and referral to the best source of charitable medical air transportation help.

National Organization for Vehicle Accessibility small grants to help complete accessible van purchases after other funding has been secured.

**Ragan's Hope** helps parents of children with catastrophic injuries by providing financial, emotional and spiritual support, in the name of Christ.

Ray Tye Medical Aid Foundation Grants for in-hospital life-saving treatments and surgeries for those who do not have medical insurance.

**RxAssist** Provides information on financial support organizations that help with the cost of prescriptions.

**Single Mothers Grants** provides financial assistance for utility bills, childcare, college, medical bills, medications, rent assistance, buying a home and more.

**Special Olympics Nebraska** Non-profit organization that uses sports to encourage and empower people with intellectual disabilities, promote acceptance and foster understanding and respect.

The Determined Parents Foundation grants money for things like co-pays, deductibles and items insurance only partially covers or does not cover at all.

The Exceptional Foundation of East Alabama seeks provides opportunities for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities to engage in social and recreational activities.

The Special Needs Alliance helps individuals with disabilities, their families and the professionals who serve them.

The Sunshine Foundation Grants special dreams to children, ages 3-18, who are chronically or seriously ill, physically challenged or have been abused.

**United Ability** is a non-profit that provides innovative services connecting people with disabilities to their communities and empowering individuals to live full and meaningful lives; particularly through building skills, education, and employment opportunities.
