Acquired Brain Injury (ABI) and Moving Forward Plan (MFP) Waivers are for Massachusetts residents living in nursing facilities or long stay hospitals, who may be able to move out and live more independently with waiver services and supports.

Brain Injury Association of Massachusetts ensures hope and support by providing brain injury prevention, awareness, education, and advocacy to survivors and their families.

Massachusetts Assistive Technology Loan Program is operated by Easter Seals Massachusetts and gives people with disabilities and their families access to low-interest cash loans so they can buy the assistive technology devices they need.

Massachusetts Association for Community Action Agencies provide emergency assistance to people in crisis; address the causes of poverty through programs that fight unemployment, inadequate housing, poor nutrition, and lack of educational opportunity; and provide training in advocacy skills.

Massachusetts Department of Transitional Assistance (DTA) is the state agency which administers all state-funded emergency programs such as food stamps (SNAP, fuel and cash assistance).

Massachusetts Department of Children and Families (DCF) works in partnership with families and communities to keep

children safe from abuse and neglect. In most cases, DCF is able to provide supports and services to keep children safe with parents or family members.

Massachusetts Department of Developmental Services (DDS) offers services and supports for individuals with intellectual disabilities and children with developmental disabilities.

Massachusetts Disability Benefits The Massachusetts Rehabilitation Commission (MRC) can help you understand how working may affect your benefits.

Massachusetts Network of Information Providers (MNIP) The NE INDEX coordinates a state-wide information network which provides up-to-date and accurate information to individuals with disabilities, their families, and those who serve them. The website will help individuals find services and programs, government programs and benefits, information in disabilities and illness and names of physicians, dentists, and consultants.

Massachusetts Office on Disability the primary mission of MOD is to ensure the full and equal participation of all people with disabilities in all aspects of life by working to advance legal rights, maximum opportunities, supportive services, accommodations and accessibility in a manner that fosters dignity and self-determination.

Massachusetts Services for Children and Youth with Special Health Needs resources and services that promote good health and quality of life for children and youth with special health care needs and their families.

Massachusetts Statewide Head Injury Program (SHIP) provides services to eligible people with external traumatic brain injuries.

Massachusetts 2-1-1 keeps an accurate and comprehensive database to find health and human services to meet your needs.

MassMATCH is the Commonwealth of Massachusetts's initiative to Maximize Assistive Technology in Consumer's Hands. Its mission is to promote the use of AT and AT services to enhance the independence of people with disabilities, enabling equal participation in all of life's activities.

Financial Aid

Economic Assistance (cash benefits) Cash benefit programs through the Massachusetts Department of Transitional Assistance to help families and individuals meet their basic needs.

Emergency Aid to the Elderly, Disabled, and Children (EAEDC) Program provides temporary cash assistance to eligible people and certain families.

Massachusetts State Supplement Program (SSP) is a state cash benefit program for qualified Massachusetts Supplemental Security Income (SSI) applicants.

Massachusetts Transitional Aid to Families with Dependent Children provides temporary cash assistance and supportive services to children, individuals and their families that meet eligibility requirements.

GrantWatch- Disability Grants information about available government and foundation grants.

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) offers aid to eligible lowincome families and individuals to ensure these families are able to obtain a nutritious diet.

Healthcare

Medicare is a federal health insurance program for retirees age 65 or older and people with disabilities.

Medicare Rights Center is a national, nonprofit consumer service organization that works to ensure access to affordable health care for older adults and people with disabilities through counseling and advocacy, educational programs and public policy initiatives.

MassHealth In Massachusetts, Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) are combined into one program called MassHealth. MassHealth members may be able to get doctors' visits, prescription drugs, hospital stays, and many other important services at little or no cost.

National Health Law Program includes detailed information about federal health policy, especially Medicaid and Medicare.

Legal Advocacy

Disability Law Center is the Protection & Advocacy agency for Massachusetts. DLC is a private, non-profit organization responsible for providing protection and advocacy for the rights of Massachusetts residents with disabilities.
